Ed, one of our bartenders, was playing with all of the above in a cocktail shaker and what came out of it at the end was really rather special, even by Ed's own standards!



In the past we've given you instructions on how to make these cocktails at home, but we're not going to tell you this time. Suffice to say that the beautifully crafted Porfidio tequila works exceptionally well with the sweet mango and passion fruit, which in turn are complemented by the gentle burn from the chilli and the Central American aroma of the coriander – it's like
