



The Japanese brew, Kirin, is now available in Australia for the first time on tap. Kirin Ichiban is a highly refreshing premium lager beer, crafted to exacting Japanese standards. The special first press method produces pure smooth flavours and the pale amber shine. crowned with a rich creamy head. Noble hops create an appetizing floral aroma, complemented by a delicate fruity character. The full-bodied palate has a subtle sweetness punctuated by mild bitter notes. In Japan, purity is one of the highest pursuits of brewing. With Kirin, this reveals itself in the special method of Ichiban, a word meaning 'first'. Only the first liquid drawn from the finest barley malt mash is then combined with Noble hops. Kirin is the name of an ancient mythical beast which foretells the coming of festive and joyous events. When the Kirin appears, good fortune and good beer soon follow. The beer is brewed locally at the Malt Shovel Brewery (home to the James Squire range) in Sydney.
